School Premises Insurance

School Premises

Coverage begins when the Insured Person leaves their residence to travel to school and

ends upon arrival at their residence after school. Coverage also applies during approved

and supervised school trips/activities. The full School Premises coverage wording is:

Injury sustained by the Insured Person while:

(a) in or on school buildings or premises by reason of attending classes on any regular school

day;

(b) in attendance at or participating in any school activity approved and supervised by proper school authority;

(c) Travelling Directly to or from any regularly scheduled and approved school activity under the

direction or supervision of a proper school authority;

(d) Travelling Directly to or from the Insured Person's Residence and school for the purpose of

attending classes or participating in any school sponsored activity.

"Travelling Directly" is defined as "any travel that would take the Insured Person directly

to or from his Residence and the school along the most normal and reasonable route without delay or stopover."
