



What is the cost for the Active 8's and 9's membership?

FREE for those Grade 8 and Grade 9 students that live or go to school in the City of Leduc or Leduc County.

When can I register for the membership?

Starting September 1 you can visit Guest Services to register so you can get moving October 1.

What facilities can you access with the membership? The LRC and Alexandra Outdoor Pool.


Blue Monday ONLINE LIVE VARIETY SHOW!
