Breakfast Program




Thanks so much to the **Grad Class of 2021** for their donation of a brand new picnic table for our students. A number of our students like to eat outside, so this will be well used!



COVID Daily Screening

Please remember to stay home if you are not feeling well. Here are the screening questions for all school aged children. If a student is feeling unwell in any way please work through this guide.

1.	Does the child have any new onset (or worsening) of the following core symptoms:		
	Fever Temperature of 38 degrees Celsius or higher	YES	NO
	Cough Continuous, more than usual, not related to other known causes or conditions such as asthma	YES	NO
	Shortness of breath Continuous, unable to breathe deeply, not related to other known causes or conditions such as asthma	YES	NO
	Loss of sense of smell or taste Not related to other known causes or conditions like allergies or neurological disorders	YES	NO
If the child answered "YES" to any symptom in question 1: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The child is required to isolate for 10 days from onset of symptoms as per CMCH Order 39-2021 OR receive a negative COVID-19 test and feel better before returning to activities. Use the AHS Online Assessment Tool or call Health Link 811 to arrange for testing and to receive additional information on isolation. 			
If the child answered "NO" to all of the symptoms in question 1, proceed to question 2.			
2.	Does the child have any new onset (or worsening) of the following other symptoms:		
	Chills Without fever, not related to being outside in cold weather	YES	NO
	Sore throat/painful swallowing Not related to other known causes/conditions, such as seasonal allergies or reflux	YES	NO
	Runny nose/congestion Not related to other known causes/conditions, such as seasonal allergies or being outside in cold weather	YES	NO
	Feeling unwell/fatigued Lack of energy, poor feeding in infants, not related to other known causes or conditions, such as depression, insomnia, thyroid dysfunction or sudden injury	YES	NO
	Nausea, vomiting and/or diarrhea Not related to other known causes/conditions, such as anxiety, medication or irritable bowel syndrome	YES	NO
	Unexplained loss of appetite Not related to other known causes/conditions, such as anxiety or medication	YES	NO
	Muscle/joint aches Not related to other known causes/conditions, such as arthritis or injury	YES	NO
	Headache Not related to other known causes/conditions, such as tension-type headaches or chronic migraines	YES	NO
	Conjunctivitis (commonly known as pink eye)	YES	NO
If the child answered "YES" to ONE symptom in question 2: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Keep your child home and monitor for 24 hours. If their symptom is improving after 24 hours, they can return to school and activities when they feel well enough to go. Testing is not necessary. If the symptom does not improve or worsens after 24 hours (or if additional symptoms emerge), use the AHS Online Assessment Tool or call Health Link 811 to check if testing is recommended. 			
If the child answered "YES" to TWO OR MORE symptoms in question 2: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Keep your child home. Use the AHS Online Assessment Tool or call Health Link 811 to determine if testing is recommended. Your child can return to school and activities once their symptoms go away as long as it has been at least 24 hours since their symptoms started. 			
If the child answered "NO" to all questions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Your child may attend school, childcare and/or other activities.

BGSD Dual Credit Program

BGSD offers a Dual Credit program which provides an exciting opportunity to BGSD high school students. Students can earn college/university credits from a post-secondary institution and high school credits from their school by completing college-level courses. All tuition fees are paid by BGSD. We are partnered with five post-secondary institutions to offer over 40 different courses this year. Spots are still available and for more information check out the [Dual Credit Handbook](#).

Additionally Black Gold has the opportunity to bring the Northern Lakes College **Mobile Trades Lab** (MTL) to the Division for the 2022-2023 school year. Students in the program complete 16 weeks of in-person trades training (both hands-on and classroom) and earn approximately 24 high school credits. Upon completion of the program, students are also able to challenge the Apprenticeship and Industry Training (AIT) first period exam, giving them an accelerated pathway to a great career in the trades.

As this is part of the Dual Credit program, there is **no cost** to students, saving them around \$2500 in tuition fees. To see the MTL in action, check out the following [video](#)!

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for this insurance, your child must reside in Canada and be more than 6 months old and less than 27 years old.

Children 14 years of age and older must be full-time students in the 12 months prior to a claim, at any time during coverage. A full-time student is defined as one who is enrolled in a minimum of three courses at the same time during any four-month period.
