
Post Secondary Information for High School Students


















Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for this insurance, your child must reside in Canada and be more than 6 months old and less than 27 years old.

Children 14 years of age and older must be full-time students in the 12 months prior to a claim, at any time during coverage.

A full-time student is defined as one who is enrolled in a minimum of three courses at the same time during any four-month period.
